

#### **CURRICULUM PLANNING**

St. Joseph Dental College is approved by the Dental Council of India and AP State Dental Council also affiliated to Dr NTR University of Health Sciences (NTRUHS).

The curriculum planning and execution of the institution's academic programs are in accordance with DCI and NTRUHS. The academic activities are specifically planned and delivered to fulfill the vision and mission of the institution and at the same time take into account the changing needs of various stakeholders namely students, the healthcare industry, and society.

Before the commencement of the academic year, NTR University of Health Sciences (NTRUHS) publishes the Academic Schedule and circulates to its affiliated colleges.

The Academic Council headed by the Principal prepares the Academic Calendar of the Institution incorporating curricular, co-curricular & extracurricular activities, exams, vacations, and important events. It is published on the college website and displayed on the notice board. Subject allocation



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is done, based on the faculty specialization and experience and approved by the Head of the Department and Principal.

The academic council meeting was conducted to discuss some important issues regarding the institution such as preparing the academic calendar and timetable, preparing teaching and internal assessment examination schedules for UG and PG programs, also to finalize the dates for the orientation program for the newly admitted BDS and MDS students and finalize the schedules of the synopsis review committee and institutional ethics committee meetings and to discuss and approve the various programs suggested by academic cell and to review interdepartmental and interdisciplinary courses and converse about actions to be taken on feedback from various stakeholders as well as to discuss the schedule of parent-teacher meetings and to speak of research grants and MOU with other academic institutions and to discuss the basic life support (BLS) hands-on program for the faculty and UG students and finally the module of implantology.

The faculty members prepare the course file for the allocated courses which includes the syllabus, course plan, unit plan, lesson plan, timetable, course objectives, clinical rotation plan, clinical requirements, evaluation criteria, outcomes and previous years' University question papers.. The log book for practical courses is prepared following the affiliated University NTRUHS.

The academic council functions are bound to promote the overall academic affairs of the institute, prepare UG&PG academic calendars, provide direction concerning methods of instruction, evaluation or research, or improvement in academic standards, and consider matters of academic interest either on its initiatives or at the insistence of the governing council and take proper action thereon.

To implement the proposals/regulations recommended by the Board of Studies and Academic Senate of the University on academic regulations, framing of syllabus and evaluation methods and introduce value-added courses/ certificate courses which are required to meet social needs and prescribe measures for departmental coordination in academic activities, prepare all academic related annual reports and make recommendations to the governing council for the Initiation of measures for improvements of standards of teaching, Training and Research Institution of fellowships, scholarships, medals, prizes, etc.



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#### **CURRICULUM DELIVERY**

For effective curriculum delivery, the institution adopts Outcome-Based Education (OBE). The curriculum is effectively delivered by integrating student-centric methodology, innovative teaching-learning methodologies, experiential learning, participatory learning, problem-solving methodologies, self-directed learning, projects, role play, interactive boards, LCD projectors, e-resources, central library, and skill labs. The clinical and community postings impart skill development to the students in the field of dentistry and help fill the gap between theoretical knowledge and practice.

Remedial teaching, individual attention, peer teaching, mentoring, and counseling are instituted for slow performers to improve their academic performance. Advanced learners are provided with opportunities to attend seminars, workshops, paper and poster presentations, project competitions, and participation in the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre to upgrade their skills to greater heights.

Assessment registers are maintained to assess the student's academic performance. Enrichment of curriculum is done by incorporating add-on courses; value-added courses, conferences, workshops, projects, health day's observance, etc.






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#### **CURRICULUM EVALUATION**


The level of attainment of Programme Outcome/Program Specific Outcome/Course outcomes is calculated by considering the university results and feedback from stakeholders.





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
# **1.1.2 QnM** Percentage of fulltime teachers participating in BoS /Academic Council of universities during the last five years






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# **1.2.1 QnM** Percentage of inter-disciplinary/inter-departmental courses/training across all the Programs offered by the College during the last five years








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**1.2.2 QnM** Average percentage of students enrolled in subject-related Certificate/ Diploma / Add-on courses as against the total number of students during the last five years.








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








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**1.3.3 QnM** Average percentage of students enrolled in the value-added courses during the last five years


